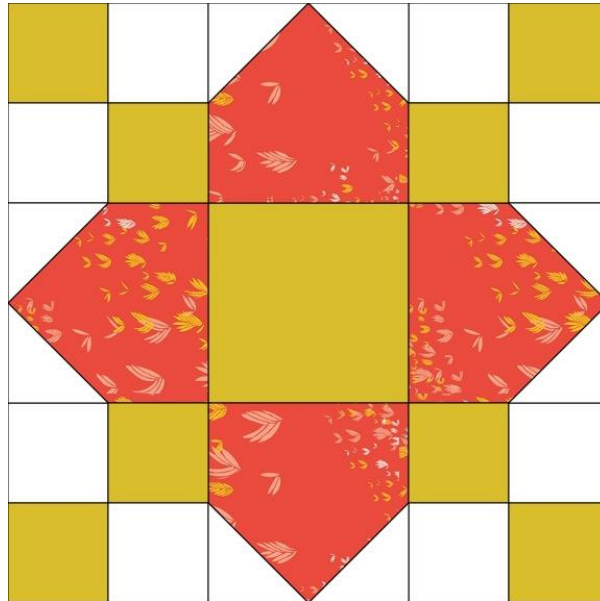


Projects

ROSE PARK 6"X 6"



This cute pattern combines two very simple squares into one quilt block that looks more complex than it actually is. Plus, once you've mastered this block, it's easy to switch out fabrics and reposition squares to get a different look for your next quilt.

Fabric Supplies:

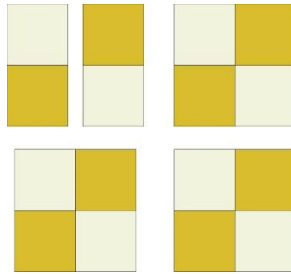
- White 1- 1/2" x 12-1/2" strips
- Yellow 1-1/2"x12-1/2" strip
2-1/2" x 2-1/2" square
- Orange (4) 2-1/2" x 2-1/2" squares

Instructions:

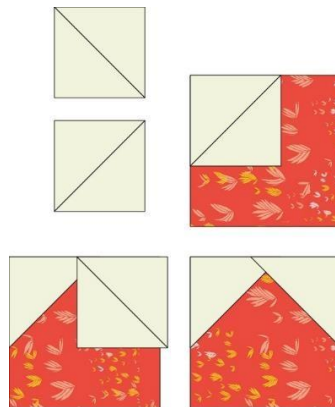
- 1.) Sew white 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip and yellow 1-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip together on long edges. Press seam toward the yellow.
- 2.) Sub cut eight 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" two-square units



- 3.) Sew two $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " units together to make a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " four-patch block. Repeat to make four $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " blocks.



- 4.) Cut remaining white $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $12\frac{1}{2}$ " strip into eight $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " squares. Draw a diagonal line across the back of each square.
- 5.) Place a white $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " square in the corner of an orange $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square. Sew directly on the line. Trim excess corner $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from seam and open up white triangle. Press toward the white. Repeat the process with another $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $1\frac{1}{2}$ " white square in opposite corner. See diagram below.



- 6) Repeat with three remaining orange squares and six remaining white squares to make four orange blocks.
- 7.) Layout the block following the diagram. Sew the pieces into three rows. Press seams toward the orange pieces.
- 8.) Sew the three rows together. Press seams toward the center.
