## Supplies:

Baby Lock® sewing and embroidery machine

LabelWorks™ II by Designer's Gallery®

Scrap fabrics

Madeira embroidery thread


Baby Lock® Tear-Away Firm Stabilizer

Temporary spray adhesive

Pinking shears

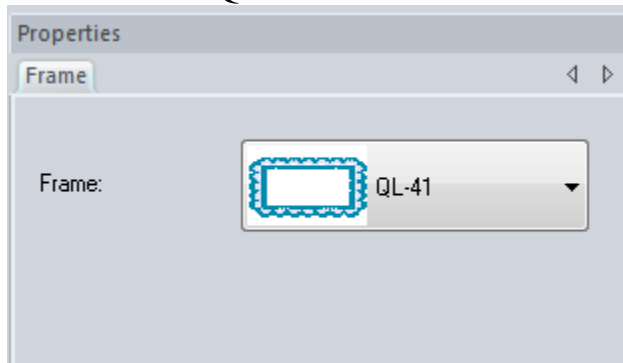
## Instructions:


### At the Computer:

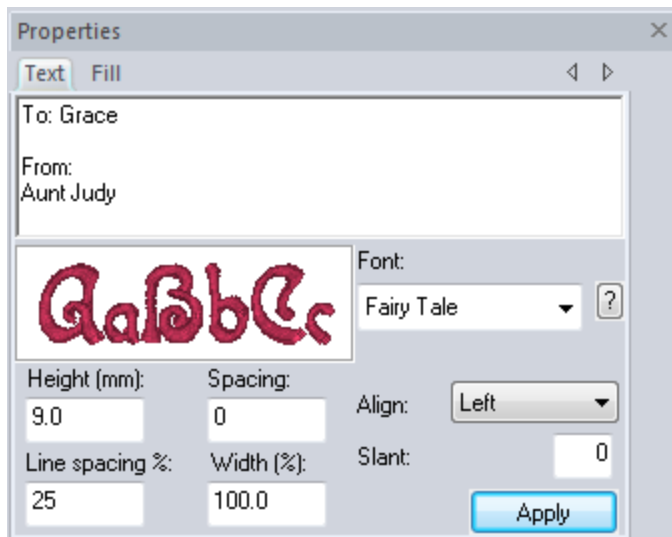
1. To open the program, click on the LabelWorks icon  on the desktop.


2. Click on the Frame icon  located on the left toolbar and follow the next set of steps:

- In the Properties field, click on the down arrow and select the frame named QL41.



- Left click on the workspace to place the frame.
  - Click on the Center icon  to place the frame in the center of the workspace.
3. To add the lettering inside the frame, follow the next set of steps:
    - Click on the Text icon.
    - Click anywhere on the workspace to open the Properties field.
    - Type in “To: Grace” on the first line and enter twice.
    - On the next line type in “From:” and enter.
    - On the last line type in “Aunt Judy”.
    - Select the Fairy Tale font.
    - Change the Height to 9.0mm.
    - Set the Alignment to Left.
    - Click on Apply.



- Place the lettering in the center of the frame.
4. To save the design, click on the Save icon  and save to the media source or to your hard drive in the format that your machine will read.

### Embroidery:

1. Hoop the stabilizer in the 130mm x 180mm hoop.
2. Place the hoop on the machine.
3. Retrieve the design and embroider the design using your favorite thread colors. **Note:** This design was digitized as an appliqué design but in this project the appliqué technique was not used.
4. Remove the label from the stabilizer.
5. Using pinking shears, pink around the outer edges to trim the edges.
6. Attach the label to the cookie jar. Use a ribbon or glue the label to the front of the jar.

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
