

## Monogrammed Infinity Scarf



Beat the winter chill in style this year by personalizing your own scarf. Using the built-in fonts on the Baby Lock Alliance you can create a monogram for a unique fashion accessory. So, grab a cup of hot cocoa and warm up with your machine!

**Skill Level: Beginner**

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### **Supplies:**

Baby Lock® Alliance  
8x8 or 5x7 Alliance embroidery hoop  
One purchased scarf (infinity or traditional)  
2 Spools decorative embroidery thread  
Baby Lock Stabilizer-Tear-away Firm  
Wash-away topping  
Mettler® Web Bond spray or other adhesive spray  
Marking pen

## Instructions:

### Hooping your fabric

1. Cut your stabilizer a little larger than your hoop of choice
2. Lightly spray your stabilizer with the adhesive spray of choice.
3. Locate the spot on your scarf for the placement of your monogram.
4. On an infinity scarf, mark approximately 12" from the center seam of your scarf. If using a traditional scarf, you can place at the bottom of one end of the scarf or again mark down from the center. If you are unsure, try on the scarf to determine an appropriate spot.
5. Hoop the scarf with the stabilizer behind the fabric. Center the scarf using the markings on the hoop.
6. If your scarf has a lot of loft to it, you may consider also adding a topping. We will be adding a basting stitch to our design, so the topping can be placed on top of the scarf prior to stitching.
7. Place your hooped scarf onto the Alliance frame holder. If working with an infinity scarf make sure to orientate the hoop so that the seam of the scarf is towards the back of the machine. Check to make sure any excess scarf fabric is clear of the hoop and needle area.
8. Thread the Alliance with the first thread color. You can also stage your second thread color on another spool for ease in transitioning colors during embroidery.
9. Note: For a scarf, you may want to match the bobbin thread to the color of the scarf. Use the built-in bobbin winder to wind a coordinating bobbin.

### Creating your Embroidery

1. From the home screen of the Alliance, select the large font Icon.



2. Select the third font on the top row.
3. Scroll through the pages to select the last name initial. Select your letter and touch Set. (Note: we are going to use the large letter size for this project)



4. Touch Add and select the built-in fonts.
5. Select font 06.
6. Select your first name initial and then touch the enter key for multi-line text. Multi-line text allows you to enter both initials at one time yet still



treat them as individual design when editing your monogram.




7. Select your middle name initial and press set.
8. Move the initials to create a monogram of your choice. If desired, resize and reshape your letters.

9. Select the Color Palette icon.



10. Adjust the colors of your first and last initials so that they coordinate with the first color of the last name initial. Touch OK.

11. Touch Embroidery.




12. Select the NEW Color Sort Icon.



13. As long as your designs are not overlapping, your colors will sort for embroidery efficiency with less thread changes.



14. Select the Basting stitch Icon to help secure the scarf in the hoop and



attach any wash-away topping you might want to use.

15. When ready to embroider, touch the Lock and Start/Stop button.

16. Cut your first color thread and tie-on the second color. Pull the threads through and re-thread the needle. Stitch out the last name initial.



17. When embroidery is complete remove the frame from the machine and un-hoop the scarf. Gently remove the basting stitches and pull the tear-away stabilizer from the back of the scarf.



18. Bundle up on those cold winter nights with your new personalized scarf.

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
