



Wine Bag



Surprise your holiday host with a party favor that's all dressed up for the evening. This cozy wine bottle wrap puts everyone in a festive mood – even before the cork is popped!

Supplies:

Baby Lock® Katherine Sewing Machine

½ yard Christmas print fabric

- 14" x 12" outside of bag
 - 14" x 17" for the lining
- Coordinating Christmas plaid fabric 14" x 6"
Madeira sewing and embroidery threads

Baby Lock Cut-Away Ultra Soft Stabilizer (BLC204)

Chalko Marker

Grosgrain ribbon

Straight-edge ruler

Instructions:

1. With right sides together, sew the plaid section to the Christmas print along the 14" side. Press the seam open.



2. Fuse the Cut-Away Ultra Soft Stabilizer to the back side of the pieced section, following the manufacturers' directions.
3. Using a Chalko marker and a straight-edge ruler, draw vertical lines on the Christmas print bottom section 2" apart from each other.
4. Select a serpentine stitch from the many built-in stitches. The width was set to 5.5 and the length to 1.0. Tip: Always do a test sew-out to visualize how the stitch will look. If a change is needed, do so at this time.
5. Using the "N" foot, place the right side of the foot next to the drawn line and stitch down the fabric. Repeat for the other lines that were drawn.
6. With the right sides together, use a 1/2" seam allowance sew the back and the bottom seams together.
7. To form the bottom of the bag, fold the sides inward at an angle and stitch 1" from the point.
8. To create the lining for the bag, with right sides together sew the back and the bottom together leaving a 3" opening from turning. To form the bottom of the lining, fold the sides inward at an angle and stitch 1" from the point. Press the seams open.
9. With right sides together, tuck the lining section inside the outer wine bag section and align the top raw edges. Sew around the top edge of the bag.
10. Turn the bag out through the opening in the lining and stitch the opening closed.
11. Topstitch along the top edge of the bag.
12. Sew an 18" piece of grosgrain ribbon to the back of the bag along the seam line, and then bring the ribbons around to tie a bow in the front.

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
