



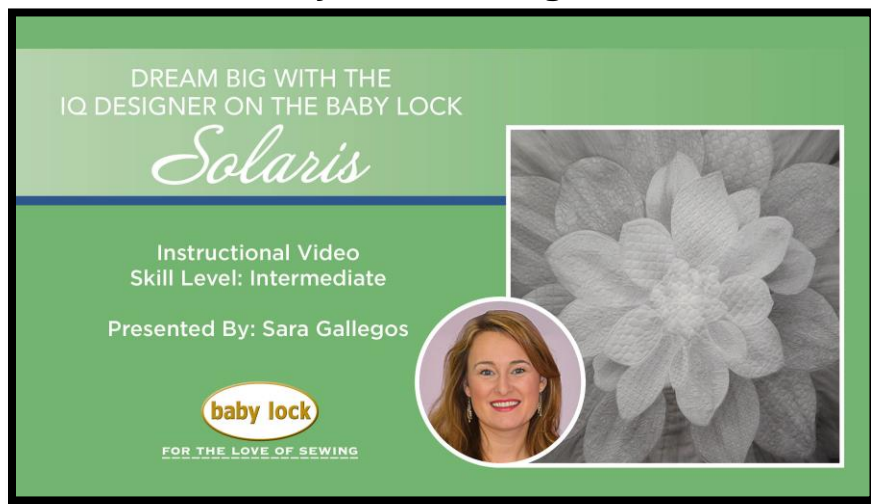
LEARN & CREATE

with Baby Lock



Dream Big with IQ Designer

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Supplies:

- Baby Lock Solaris or Destiny 2 with Upgrades
- Magnetic Hoop
- Stylus
- Embroidery Unit & Foot
- 1 Dream Big Panel from Hoffman Fabrics
- Crib Sized Batting
- Backing Fabric
- Curved Safety Pins
- Microtex Needles
- 3-4 Spools Coordinating Thread
- 4-5 Bobbins

Preparation:

- On a large, flat surface, layout backing fabric with right side facing down and smooth out any wrinkles.
- Layer batting on top of backing fabric and smooth out wrinkles.
- Carefully layer Dream Big Panel on top of quilt sandwich with right side facing up and smooth.



- Starting from the center of the panel, secure three layers together by creating a 5” grid with curved safety pins. *This will hold all of the layers together and prevent any shifting of the quilt sandwich during quilt.
- Wind 4-5 bobbins with thread to match backing.
- Insert new Microtex Needle.

Creating Designs:

1. Using the largest hoop you have, hoop the center of the panel. Remove any safety pins that are block the hoop from closing and all safety pins in the hooped area of the panel.
2. *Tip: Working with a Magnetic Hoop makes this job much easier! If you are not working with a magnetic hoop, loosen the hoop screw quite a lot before trying to hoop quilt. Once quilt is hooped, tighten with hoop screwdriver to make sure the quilt is secure.
3. From the home screen, select **IQ Designer**.
4. Select the **Scan** Option
5. **Image Scan**
6. **Scan**
7. Enhance the image for better visibility.
8. Select **Line Properties**
9. Select **Point to Point** Drawing Tool
10. Turn On **No Sew**
11. Touch **OK**
12. Touch on screen from point to point around center portion of scanned flower image on screen. You will see a red line showing the border you have created. Once you have gone around the design, touch the red box on screen to close the border. This will create a closed area for filling.
13. Select **Fill Properties**
14. Choose a color that you will see easily on screen.
15. Select the last fill option.
16. Touch **Select**
17. Choose a fill that you like then touch **OK**.
18. Touch **OK** to leave fill properties screen
19. Select the **Region Fill Cup** Icon
20. Touch inside the area you created.
21. Touch **Next**
22. Make adjustments to fill like Random Shift, Size, Direction, Etc.
23. Turn the **Outline off**.
24. *Tip: We selected “No Sew” when we created the boundary to fill. This outline will be around the fill design, so it also needs to be turned off.
25. One you are pleased with the look, touch Set to move into the Embroidery Editing Screen.
26. Touch “Embroidery” to move into the Embroidery Stitching Screen.
27. Stitch Design!
28. *Tip: You may need to adjust your tension down based on the needle/bobbin thread combination you are working with.



29. Re-hoop panel so that another petal is within the embroidery field.
30. *Tip: Get to know the markings on your inner hoop ring to make sure your petal is within the stitchable area.
31. Repeat the scanning steps.
32. Select **Line Properties**
33. **Multi Point to Point Tool**
34. **No Sew**
35. **OK**
36. Trace outline of petal to create fill area.
37. Fill Petal.
38. To add more dimension and separation between the petals, try adding an outline.
39. Select **Line Properties**
40. Touch the **Pencil Drawing Tool** on the far left.
41. Select **Single Straight Stitch**, then touch **OK**
42. Without lifting a finger or stylus off of screen, draw a continuous outline along edges of petal.
43. Once the petal is filled and outlined, touch **Preview** and **OK**.
44. Edit design as desired.
45. Once pleased with design, touch **Set**.
46. Touch **Embroidery**.
47. Stitch Design!
48. Repeat the re-hooping, scanning and editing process until your panel is complete!
