## FontWorks – Décor Frames




The 51 Décor frame designs included in FontWorks make it easy to create framed lettering. Elegant framed monograms or quilt labels are fast, fun, and easy with FontWorks.

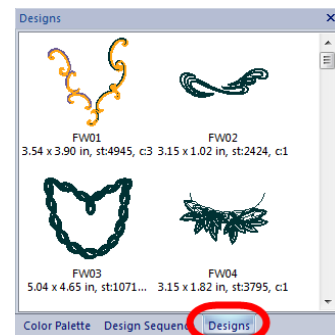
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### Frame for Quilt Label

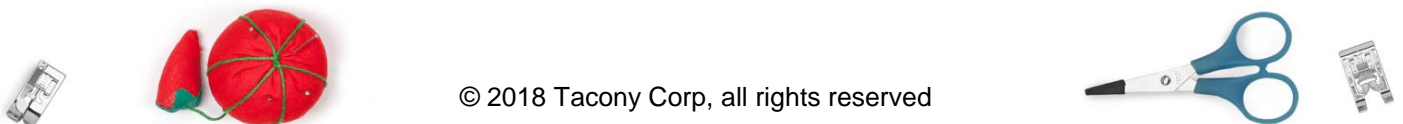
Everything you need to create an embroidered label for your next quilt can be found in FontWorks. Use one of the many fonts that can be stitched in very small sizes and frame it with one of the built-in designs that are included in FontWorks and you will have a quick and easy label ready to add to your finished quilt.

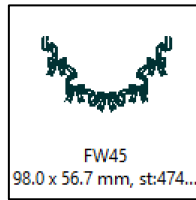
1. Left click **Draw 3D** 
2. Left click **Hoop** 
3. Left click **Select Hoop** 
4. Select the 200mm x 200mm frame
5. Left click **OK** 



There are 51 embroidery designs included in FontWorks. These are designed to frame and embellish your lettering.

1. Left click the **Designs** tab  in the lower right corner of the page.
2. Scroll down to see the 51 different designs





3. Left click to select design FW45
  - Each design shows its name.
  - The design size is also given.
  - The pattern has 4,741 stitches
  - Left click inside the hoop on the design page and the selected design is placed on the page



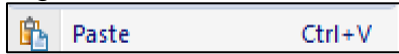
4. Left click Select
5. Click and drag to move the design to the bottom of the hoop

6. Right click and select Copy



in the right-click menu

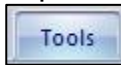
7. Right click and select Paste



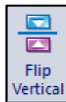

- The new design is pasted right on top of the previous design

8. Left click the Tools tab

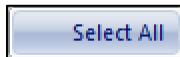


9. Left click Flip Vertical

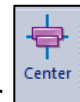


10. Click and drag the flipped design to position it so the two designs form a frame

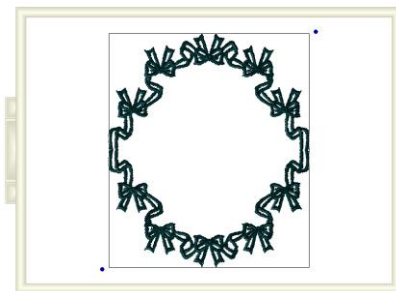
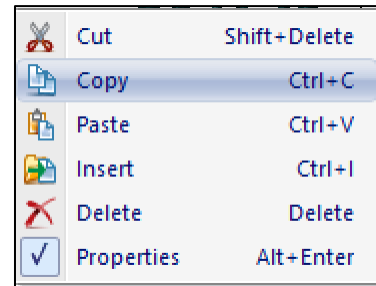
11. Left click Select

13. Return to the Home tab

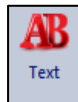


## Select a Font

When you need small lettering for any of your projects, you will find that many of the built-in fonts in your FontWorks will be able to fill that need.

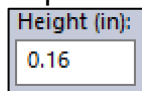
- There are seven small fonts designed for specific sizes in FontWorks
  - These fonts are not scalable, which means that they cannot be re-sized.
  - The non-scalable fonts are specifically digitized to be stitched at the specified size.
  - They are easy to recognize in the Font list because they have their size included in the name of the font.
    - Arial Bold 5mm** (5mm only)
    - Block 4mm** (4mm only)
    - Serial 4mm** (4mm only)
    - Small Script 5mm** (5mm only)
    - Stroke 8mm** (8mm only)
    - Token 5mm** (5mm only)
    - Vogue 5mm** (5mm only)
- The FontWorks fonts also include another 30 fonts that can be re-sized to stitch at sizes of 10mm or smaller

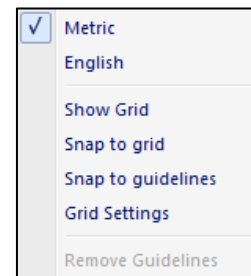
- Left click **Text**
- Left click in the hoop on the design page and a MY TEXT is placed on the design page
- Open the Font window and select the font called **Serial 4mm**

Note that in the Properties box the size of the lettering is

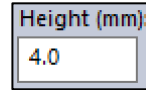


shown in inches

- Right click anywhere on the ruler at the edge of the design page
- Select Metric from the pop-up menu and the ruler is changed to millimeters



- When you are editing small fonts, you may want to change



FontWorks to give you sizing in millimeters.

- Millimeters are three times smaller than 1/8-inch increments, so you have more control as you size those small letters.
3. Note that in the Properties box the size of the lettering is now shown in millimeters

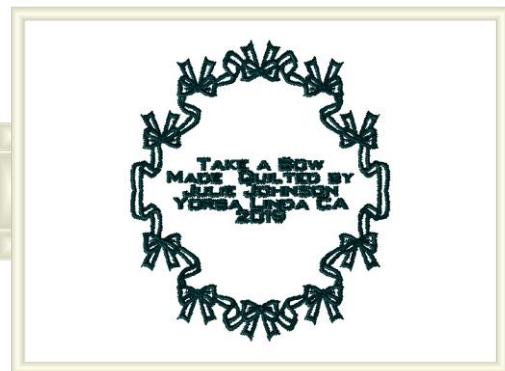
## Create Multi Line Text

It is easy to create multiple lines of text in FontWorks.

1. There are many opinions about what information should be included in a quilt label, but some or all of the following information can be included:
  - The name of the quilt
  - Who designed the quilt (If you used someone's pattern, you should give them credit)
  - Who pieced the quilt top
  - Who did the quilting
  - The city and state where the quilt was made
  - The year the quilt was finished or if desired both the start and finish dates.
  - Was the quilt made for a special occasion or as a gift
  - If desired, you can also include an inspirational saying or quote.
2. Left click and drag to highlight the MY TEXT in the Properties box and type the information you want to include in your quilt label
  - Type the text exactly the way you want to stitch it, using the same upper-case and lower-case lettering, numbers, and any punctuation you want stitched.
  - At the end of each line, touch Enter on your keyboard to move down to the next line just as you would when typing an email.
  - There is no limit on the number of text lines FontWorks will accept, so you can use as many lines of text as you can fit into your embroidery hoop.
  - Or in this case as many lines as can fit into the frame

4. Type the text in the Properties box and left click Apply
5. Click and drag to position the text in the frame

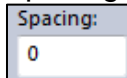


## Editing Tiny Fonts

The editing tools work in the same way even though the text is very small

Sometimes when fonts are changed to very small sizes, you may feel like it all looks crowded.

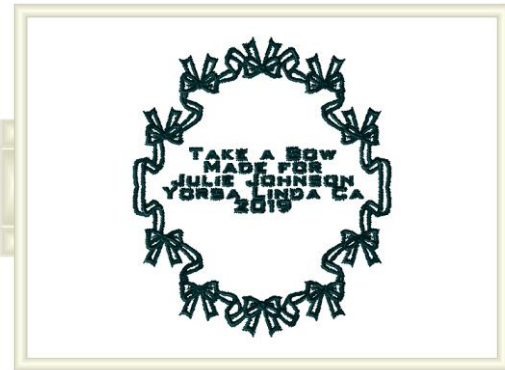
1. Change the Spacing to move all the letters just a little farther apart.
2. Spacing is currently set at zero



3. Left click and drag to highlight the number in the Spacing window
4. Type **3** and left click **Apply**



to move the letters farther apart.

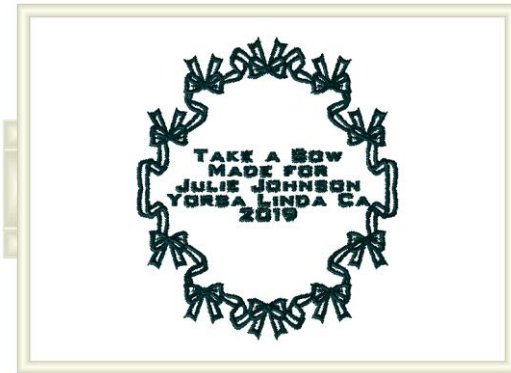


Line Spacing is used when you have more than one line of text to control the amount of space between the lines.

1. The default setting is for the space between lines to be 25% of the height of the letters.

- So, if the letters were 1 inch tall, the space between lines would be  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch.
- These letters are 3mm tall, so the space between the lines is 1mm and it could use a more room between the lines.

2. Left click and drag to highlight the 25 in the Line Spacing box to highlight it.



3. Type **40** and left click **Apply**



- Now there is more open space between the lines

If desired, you can also change the colors in the design.

1. Left click the Design Sequence tab
2. Select the Text at the bottom of the Design Sequence
3. Left click the color chip of your choice to change the color of the text
4. Left click the frame at the top of the Design Sequence










5. Left click the color chip of your choice to change the color of the frame


And here is one last tip for small lettering. If you are using a tiny font on a project that will be gently used and carefully laundered, try sewing your tiny font with 100wt silk thread. Using a very fine silk thread will give you beautiful tiny lettering.

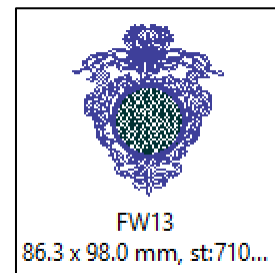
## One Initial, One Color Monogram


If some monogramming fonts do not have any decorative frames how do you add a decorative frame? You will be able to use the 51 frame designs included in FontWorks to embellish those monogram fonts.

1. Left click **New**  on the Quick Access toolbar
2. Left click to turn on **Draw 3D** 
3. Left click the **Hoop icon** 
  - Left click **Select Hoop** 
  - The hoops box opens
  - Select the **130mm x 180mm** hoop 
  - Place a check mark in the box for **Rotate 90** 
  - Left click **OK** 

Select a Décor frame to use with the monogram.

1. Left click the **Designs tab**  in the lower right corner of the page
2. Scroll down to see the different designs
3. Find the design called FW13
4. Left click to select the **design**
5. Left click on the **design page** and the design is placed on the design page.
6. Left click the **Tools tab** 
7. Left click **Select**  and the frame is selected





8. Left click Center  and the frame is centered in the hoop

Now you are ready to create your monogram

1. Return to the Home tab

2. Left click **Monogram** 
3. Left click on the **design page**
4. Open the Font window and select **Tuxedo Monogram**

5. Left click and drag to select the **ABC**  in the Letters box in Properties
6. **Type** a single letter monogram in the Letters box

 in Properties

- Monograms do not have to have three letters!

7. Left click **Apply** 



Move the monogram into position on the frame


1. Left click and drag to move the monogram into place in the center of the circle opening on the embroidered frame.




This type of monogram is often stitched all in one color. It is easy to change the look to a single color.

1. Left click the **black arrow** at the bottom of the

**Select icon** 














2. Left click **Select All** 
- All of the embroidery on the page is selected, so both the monogram and the design are selected

3. Left click on the **color chip**  for the desired color in the Color Palette.
- And now you have a beautiful single-color monogram with a decorative frame.




## Font Art Frame

The frames available in the Font Art tool can also be used to create a custom frame for a monogram.


1. Left click New  on the Quick Access tool bar
2. Left click Draw 3D 
3. Left click the Hoop icon 
  - Left click **Select Hoop** 
  - The hoops box opens
  - Select the **200mm x 200mm** hoop
  - If there is a check mark in the box for **Rotate 90** , left click to remove the check mark 
  - Left click **OK** 
4. Left click the Font Art icon  and the Font Art tool opens.
5. Select the shape called Frame 01 
6. Set the Shape Type window on Satin 
7. Leave the Width and Height set at the default size 
8. Left click Remove All Words  and click yes in the pop-up box so just the frame can be saved
9. Left click Generate 





10. Left click OK  to save the frame to the design page

Adding a Bean Stitch to sew on top of the satin stitch will add another layer of texture for a more interesting frame.

1. Left click the Font Art icon  and the Font Art tool opens.


2. Select the shape called Frame 01 

3. Set the Shape Type window on Run Bean 

4. Leave the Width and Height set at the default size 

5. Left click Remove All Words  so just the frame can be saved


6. Left click Generate 

7. Left click OK  to save the frame to the design page

## Add a Smaller Frame

It is easy to add a second slightly smaller frame.




1. Left click the Font Art icon  and the Font Art tool opens.

2. Select the shape called Frame 01 







3. Set the Shape Type window on Satin 

4. Change the Width to 100mm and the Height is automatically adjusted because there is a check mark in the Maintain aspect ratio box.




5. Left click Remove All Words  so just the frame can be saved
6. Left click Generate 
7. Left click OK  to save the frame to the design page

Add the Run Bean stitch detail to the smaller frame.

1. Left click the Font Art icon  and the Font Art tool opens.
2. Select the shape called Frame 01 
3. Set the Shape Type window on Run Bean 
4. Change the Width to 100mm and the Height is automatically adjusted because there is a check mark in the Maintain aspect ratio box.
5. Left click Remove All Words  so just the frame can be saved
6. Left click Generate 
7. Left click OK  to save the frame to the design page

## Add the Monogram

Add a monogram to the frame to complete the framed monogram.

1. Left click Monogram Text in the ribbon 
2. Left click on the design page and a monogram with the letters ABC is placed on the design page
3. Open the Font list in the Properties box at the right side of the page to select the monogram font.

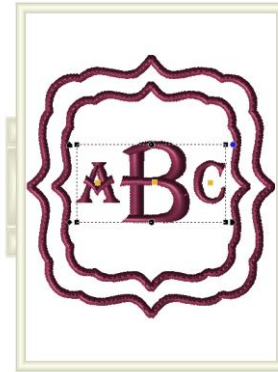

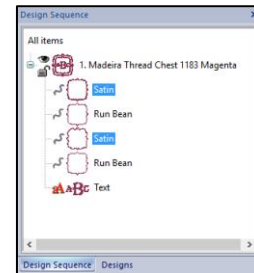

  7. Click and drag to position the monogram in the center of the frame.

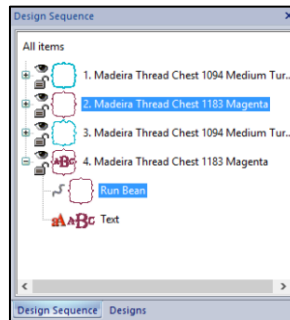


The easiest way to change the colors is to select the various parts of the monogram in the Sequence View

1. Hold down the Control key on the keyboard and left click to select both satin frames
2. Left click a color chip  to change the color of the satin frames















3. Hold down the Control key on the keyboard and left click to select both Run Bean frames
4. Left click a color chip  to change the color of the Bean Stitch accent on the frames
5. Left click to select the monogram
6. Left click a color chip  to change the color of the letters













