



Quilt Piecing with the Euphoria Featuring Chris Tryon



Join Chris in this latest video on the Baby Lock Euphoria as she shares her secrets using the chain stitch to piece a quilt.

We're going to start with the Standard Presser foot that came with your machine in the central needle position.

We are sewing using the Chain Stitch

- Reasons for Chain Stitching on a serger
 - Faster
 - Easier to remove a stitch – must faster
 - No winding a bobbin -the chain looper thread = endless thread
 - Allows you to chain pieces together

Standard Presser foot – BLCS-GP

- Needle Position – C2 position
- Presser foot – use the 2nd or middle position on the foot
- Needle Plate -align your fabric edge with the ¼" marking on your needle plate
- Chain stitch pieces together
- Finger press seams open



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Remove Stitches easily

- Clip needle thread where you ended your stitching, remove the next two stitches, turn fabric over and on back side, pull the chain looper thread .

Changing Your Foot

- The Standard foot is an enclosed frame – you can't take the foot off without threads being cleared
- Lower your needle
- Reverse your needle – raise your presser foot lever
- This releases your chain looper thread from the needle thread
- Remove your Standard presser foot

Lace Applicator foot – BLE8-LF

- Attach the snap-on lace applicator foot
 - Great foot to start out with piecing on a serger
 - Foot Rail – similar to the ¼” rail on your sewing machine
 - Adjustable to the left or right to C1 or C3 – adjust guide with ¼” distance between edge and needle
 - May be used with overlock stitches along with chain stitch
 - Adjustable guide to the 01 position – exactly ¼” from needle
 - Place fabric next to guide, up to needle
 - Start the needle in fabric
 - Follow through guiding the fabric past the corners
 - Perfect ¼” seam
 - Finger press or iron press seams

TIP: The serger evenly feeds fabric due to differential feed system

Open Toe Foot BLE-OT

Sewing Angles on the Bias

- Really easy to stretch due to pinning, removing stitches etc. so let's change feet

Why I like the open toe foot

- Big open area on the foot makes it easy to see – easy to see fabric edge between the red lines
- Great foot for Decorative stitching
- All the markings on the foot are in red and very easy to see them & reflect needle positions – in this case were using the C2 needle position
- Great for stitching angles cut on bias
- Snap the foot on
- This foot can be used for overlock, chain and cover stitch
 - Let's create a Flying Geese Block
- Line fabric up – sew along the edge of marking on needle plate and red marking on foot

TIP: Cut practice pieces and check your ¼” seam after sewing to get the hang of it

- Finger press seams
- Place fabric under presser foot manually, use the knee lift or lift the toe of the foot



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Whether it's a straight line, 4 patch or something with angles, using any of these feet, the Open Toe, the Standard or the Lace foot, it's easy to piece on Baby Lock Sergers and the Euphoria
